Literacy (Reading and Writing)

- Planned reading and writing activities will be based around our core books, *Errol's Garden, Yucky Worms, Anna Hibiscus' Song, and Ruby's Worry.*Videos of the stories will be uploaded to Tapestry, please watch these and enjoy with your children at home. We will also be sending our key **vocabulary** home, with definitions, please practice using these words at home
- The children will continue with daily **phonics** sessions, following the 'Read, Write Inc.' scheme. We will work on letter sounds, and blending sounds together for reading and writing. Phonics videos will be uploaded to Tapestry weekly. Please practice with your children at home.
- Children will continue to practise forming letters and writing sentences and paragraphs. They will have lots of opportunities to engage in writing independently
- We will enjoy a wide range of texts, both fiction and non-fiction and will have storytime every day

Reading at Home

- The children will continue to take home their reading book everyday, along with a book from the class library. Please remember to bring your child's reading folder to school in their bookbag everyday.
- Your child will bring home a 'phonics' book for them to read to you, and a story or non fiction book for you to read to your child or to share together have a look at the video on the Reception page of the website for further explanation (English and Turkish versions)
- Please look after our books. There will be a charge for books that are damaged or lost

Maths

- The focus is on developing a deep knowledge of numbers 1 to 20
- The children will be counting, recognising numbers and learning simple addition and subtraction.
- We will be practising subitising (recognising without counting) amounts to five
- Learning number bonds to 10 continues
- We will be problem solving and learning about mass, time, money, and measurements.
- Number rhymes, games, everyday objects and situations will support the children's mathematical development

Other curriculum areas

- Understanding the world
 - Science we will continue to look at life cycles and will have caterpillars in class, observing the changes until they become butterflies. We will be planting various vegetables, looking after them and watching then grow, and eating them! We will link this with our key text 'Errol's Garden'. We will be finding out about worms, and digging for them outside, linked to the book 'Yucky Worms'
 - o History we will be learning about chronology through changes over time and lifecycles in relation to growing plants and caterpillars
 - Geography we will be learning about globes and maps and exploring similarities and differences between the UK and other countries, in relation to our core text 'Anna Hibiscus' Song'
- Expressive arts and design
 - Art our focus artist this term is Georgia O'Keefe, and we will be working on observational drawings and paintings of the natural world, including flowers and plants, again linked to 'Errol's Garden'





- o Music our weekly music sessions with Mr Roberts continue, exploring tune, rhythm, pitch and various instruments
- Our key songs this term are: Pop Goes the Weasel, What does the Clock Say? Baby 1,2,3, This Little Light of Mine
- PE- Will be on Friday's, we will be focusing on using the apparatus and jumping on and off and landing safely. Develop ball skills and team games in preparation for sports day in July.

Forest Learning

• Each class will continue with weekly forest learning sessions, which involves natural, exploratory play, with activities that encourage problem solving and collaboration, as well as developing children's physical skills and understanding of nature.
