

<ul> <li>The children will continue to use the RWI phonic &amp; reading scheme on a daily basis, building on their existing knowledge and embedding the Set 3 sounds.</li> <li>They will also be encouraged to apply their phonic knowledge during all</li> </ul>	Children will continue composing a sentence with simple punctuation. As well as using capital letters and full stops correctly children will learn to extend their writing with adjectives and conjunctions. They will also ensure they re-read their written work to check that it makes sense.	<ul> <li>In Maths we will be focusing on developing their understanding of number.</li> <li>They should be able to read, order &amp; write numbers to at least 20 and, by the end of July the expectation will be to 100.</li> <li>They will be given opportunities to develop their skills using simple</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Our main topic this half term is</li> <li>'Animals including Humans'.</li> <li>The children will learn about a variety of common animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds &amp; mammals, including humans.</li> <li>They will learn how to compare and contrast</li> </ul>





- As a class they will use 'Talk through Stories' once a week to develop their recognition of words, broaden vocabulary and target their comprehension skills.
- We start each day with a session of reading as the children come into class to set up the expectation for the rest of the day.
- They will all have daily opportunities to develop their writing skills through the RWI scheme, handwriting (all children will learn cursive handwriting) and topic sessions.
  - Speaking and listening will continue to be a priority with children given many opportunities to develop their oracy skills. For all lessons we will be encouraging children to ask questions and keep their curiosity keen to find out more information. They will always be encouraged to speak in full sentences and given the opportunity to share their ideas.
