PARENTS EVENINGS: Thank you to everyone who attended our parents evenings last month. MEASLES IN SCHOOL – KEEPING SAFE: Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. LATYMER SCHOOL OPEN DAY: 25th April 2024, 12pm-5pm (TBC) for current **Year 5** pupils – for entry in **September 2025** – please access Latymer's website for all their admission details.

TWO YEAR OLD PROVISION: From April 2024 the eligibility rules will be changed to extend to families where both parents are working. If you feel you may be eligible please contact the school office for further details. This would cover 15 hours per week/38 weeks term time – 3 hours per day over five days.

TERRIFIC TWOS – paid places: We are able to offer places in TWOS at £20 per session for parents who are not eligible for funding. This would be for up to five 3-hour sessions per week, mornings or afternoons during term time. Please contact our school office if you are interested

NUT ALLEGIES: We are a healthy eating school and several of our children have severe nut allergies. Please **DO NOT** send any child into school with nut products (peanut butter, nutella etc) or chocolates or biscuits and cakes containing nuts in their lunch boxes. Even the smell of these products can cause an allergic reaction to another child sitting nearby.

WATER BOTTLES: Please remember to send your child to school with a **plastic water** bottle showing their name – not a metal bottle.

ATTENDANCE: We would like all parents to know that our target for school attendance remains at 96%. Please report your child's absence from school before **9.30am** by telephoning 020 88075335 (Select Option 1 for Attendance) and advise us of the reason for your child's absence.

KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE: ROAD SAFETY & Parking in Wilbury

Way/Weir Hall Road: Please remember that road safety is the responsibility of everyone and we must ensure all our children are safe at all times. Please remember to park sensibly outside our school for the safety of all our children and **DO NOT** stop on the mini roundabout to drop off your child as this is extremely dangerous. In consideration of our neighbours, please do not park across their driveways whether the car is there or not. If they have a dropped kerb you could be fined up to £250 if traffic wardens are in attendance and it is towed.

Please keep well away from the bus stop area as this is very dangerous for children boarding or leaving the buses.
