COVID-19 Catch-up Premium

Introduction

Children have missed out on their education across the country. In addition, it is clear from research that the disadvantage gap will have increased during the times of school closure and uncertainty and the Catch-Up funding is provided to try and support schools in bringing children back to the expected standards and in closing this gap.

The funding is provided in two ways:

- All schools across the country will receive £80 per child over the academic year 2020/21 to spend as they see best to support their children to catch-up
- £350 million has been allocated to specific programmes which schools in areas of significant disadvantage can access for free or at very reduced rates. Since our school is recognised as being in an area of disadvantage we can access the programmes which are specifically open to us:
 - 1. Academic Mentoring: Employed by the school, trained by Teach First, these Mentors will provide intensive support for identified children
 - 2. Tutoring Programme: Schools can access reduced cost tutoring from specific providers to support identified children
 - 3. Reception Year Early Language Programme (NELI)

The intention is not that schools access all the provision, but make strategic decisions about how best to ensure their children catch-up on their lost learning as a result of the pandemic.

School Allocation

Under the generic funding of £80 per pupil, this school will be receiving £63,440 over the academic year 2020/21.

The school will be using this money for:

- a. To employ a full-time high quality catch-up/cover teacher for the autumn term to support teachers and children in years 3 & 4.
- b. To employ a high quality teacher for an extra day a week to support the children and teachers in years 3 & 4 across the whole year from October half term
- c. To employ an extra full-time year 1 TA to enable our current year 1 TAs to offer daily targeted interventions for phonics, reading and maths

- d. To pay the on costs for the academic mentors who will offer targeted support for year 5 from February half term
- e. To employ an Early Years TA to support SEND pupils and enable Reception and Nursery teachers to deliver targeted interventions

DFE funded programmes

Since this school is entitled to access the programmes set up to support schools in areas of disadvantage, this school will be;

- a. Employing two academic mentors. Teach First will provide academic mentors from February half term 2021
- b. Accessing tutoring

Implementation

The academic mentors will be working with year 5 children. The children are identified in collaboration with the DHT/Assessment Lead, Assistant Headteacher KS2U and the year 6 teachers.

The Tutoring programme will support disadvantaged and lowest 20% in years 3, 4, & 5. The children will be identified by DHT/Assessment Lead and Assistant Headteacher KS2U.
